19:11:01 Opening Worship Jean read a passage from NEYM Faith and Practice, followed by a time of silence.

19:11:02 Review of Minutes Minutes of October 2019 reviewed and approved as submitted.

19:11:03 Clerks' report

- Tom reported Joe Garren's membership has been transferred from Brooklyn Meeting to Middlebury Meeting. We welcome him into membership with us. Tom adds "NYYM is loathe to give him up".
- Lease agreement between Havurah of Addison County and Middlebury Friends Meeting discussed. Chris, Tom, and Jean met with representatives of Havurah House to review the rental agreement.

Clarification of snow removal responsibility and if additional rental fees would be due should the space be used beyond the specified hours is ongoing. Havurah requested:

- 1] The metal chairs without padding be stored in the basement. (Padded and white ones to be stored as in past.) The metal chairs would be available for use if needed.
- 2] Cushions be placed atop the piano for storage rather than on the chairs.

Chris has volunteered to help Havurah with a design to improve the steps on the front walk which routinely ices in winter. Havurah House has requested his help as well with improving their sign, and has agreed to MFM having a small sign that remains in place.

Meeting for Business agrees to new rental agreement with Havurah House.

19:11:04 Treasurer's Report Report is submitted from Karen Nawn-Fahey as of 17 November. From 21 October through 17 November the Meeting had member donations of \$3245. From 21 October through 17 November Meeting expenditures totaled \$4143.33, including \$133.33 for Children's Program Coordinator, \$40 for Child Care, \$25 for MACA (Middlebury Area Clergy Association), \$420 for the Warming Shelter, and \$3525 for Benevolences. 2019 benevolences are all paid.

When these checks clear, the balance in the checking account will be \$1438.19.

The current balance of the Rachel Harper Carey Fund is \$490.

Funds donated for Warming Shelter: \$320.

Funds donated for Solar Panel Project: \$900.

Balance of Vision for Vermont funds: \$486.86.

The finance Committee brought a draft 2020 budget for first review. Friends proposed several several changes. (See this newsletter, pgs. 6-7.) The budget will be brought for approval to the January Meeting for Business
