**20:10:01 Opening worship** Following a time of silence, Joe Garren read from Listening Spirtuality: Corporate Spiritual Practices among Friends by Patricia Loring.

**20:10:02 Review of Minutes** Minutes of September reviewed. After an error in spelling a Friend's name was corrected, the minutes were approved.

### 20:10:03 Co-clerks Report

- Jean Rosenberg read a report submitted by Shulamith Clearbridge on her studies in School of the Spirit course: Participating in God's Power. Shulamith ended her active participation in the program as of September; she expresses gratitude to the Meeting for support in her studies. Worship and Study was requested to thank Shulamith for her report and to follow up on her offer to share with the Meeting the topics and methods she experienced in the Participating in God's Power program. The Meeting appreciates and accepts her report.
- Two letters from the Clerk of NEYM were received:

1] Letter of Apology to Native Americans, and

2] Call to Urgent Loving Action for the Earth and her Inhabitants

Each of these critical and timely issues was discussed by Friends.

We were asked to consider changing our language concerning our relationship with Native Americans, past and present, to reflect reality. We are reminded to hold these matters both gently and persistently, being tender and generous toward ourselves and one another.

There is a Quaker Speak video on the subject.

Questions arose from the discussion, including:

- how do we live into this apology?
- how do we seek right relationships with indigenous people, in particular considering the Abenaki lands where we live?
- how do we focus attention to the justice issues that a Friend describes as seeming like "a wave of new energy"?
- how this can be considered by First Day School?

Jean suggests broadening the discussion to the Meeting as a whole. Worship and Study will consider how to best do this.

On the second issue, the Clerks request the Earthcare Committee consider responses, which they agreed to do. They will report to Meeting for Business in November.

**20:10:04 Treasurer's Report** From 19 September through 16 October, the Meeting had member donations of \$3645, including \$1125 for the Community Supper. During this interval Meeting expenditures totaled \$2746.83, including \$133.33 for Children's Program Coordinator, \$60 for Childcare, \$800 to NEYM, \$125 to NWQM, \$662.50 to Havurah, \$366 to Pratt's Store and \$600 to Karen Nawn-Fahey to reimburse for Community Supper expenses. When all these checks clear, the checking account balance will be \$7639.83 (including RCH and VFV funds).

Current balance of Vision for Vermont funds: \$324.85

Current balance of the Rachel Carey Harper fund is \$630.

Karen Nawn-Fahey provided information about finances at the end of the third quarter:

- Benevolences are on track.
- Funds remain in this year's budget for children's programming and books/library. Friends involved in these programs will consider use of these monies in the calendar year.

Of the \$1125 donated to the Meeting for the Community Supper, \$459 remains. Karen requests discussion for use of these funds. She reports that the Community Suppers program has secured grant funding to help sustain it through December. Ideas included holding funds aside for future need in Community Suppers program, or donating to the goal of the program remaining sustainable.

The Finance committee will be drafting a budget proposal for next year in the coming weeks.

## 20:10:05 Report from Committee exploring a Meeting Zoom account

This committee of Grace McGrath, Spence Putnam, Ruah Swennerfelt, and Ed Harris met in early October via Zoom. A "pro" Zoom account is \$150 per year. It permits one meeting at a time, and hosting can be shared among those in Meeting, as for First Day School or committees, Friendly Forum or Coffeehouse. Ed volunteers to be the admin/ support person for anyone who wants guidance learning to use Zoom.

Discussion followed, and there was agreement on establishing a Zoom account. The committee will proceed to establish a Zoom pro account for MFM. The committee agreed to stay on during beginning use.

**20:10:06** Count Every Vote Vermont Spence Putnam introduced a proposal requesting the Meeting to endorse publically the 'Count Every Vote Vermont' endeavor with which he is involved. This program is a spin-off from George Lakey's work.

Submitting this for publication in the *Addison Independent* would be accompanied by a cover statement acknowledging complete confidence in vote counting and the integrity of Vermont Town Clerks, Selectboards, and Boards of Civil Authority. After discussion, the Meeting endorses the proposal including the accompanying letter.

### 20:10:07 Committee Reports

The Nominating Committee reports that with the nomination and acceptance of Ruah Swennerfelt as Rising Treasurer, all Meeting positions except Rising Co-clerk have been filled. The committee will lay down its work until late winter when positions for the year beginning July 2021 will again be considered. In the absence of urgent matters needing attention, other committee reports were deferred in the interest of time.

### 20:10:08 Closing Worship

The meeting concluded with a time of quiet.
