Middlebury Friends Meeting Monthly Meeting for Business

Present were Laura Asermily, Win Colwell, Wendy Goodwin, Stuart Kirkaldy, Grace McGrath, and Karen Nawn-Fahey.

08.07.01 Minutes from 15 June 2008 were accepted as printed in the newsletter with one correction: The last sentence under item #2, should be amended to say that Spence Putnam has been asked, and agreed, to serve as co-treasurer, pending approval by monthly meeting.

o8.07.02 Co-treasurer nominee, Spence Putnam, was approved, with gratitude for his willingness to serve in this capacity.

o8.07.03 Treasurer's Monthly Report and Finance Committee Report (from Laura Asermily). "During the month of June, the final month of the fiscal year, we had income of \$2,346 and expenses totaling \$767.85 (\$203.85 Books, \$21 Newsletter, \$240 children's program, \$13.00 miscellaneous, \$40.00 Friend's Journal ad, and \$250 Quaker camps). For the entire year our income was \$9,468.46, \$566.54 less than the \$10,035 anticipated by the budget. Expenditures for the entire year were \$9,752.25, or \$282.75 less than the budget amount of \$10,035. The cash balance rose from \$3,903.28 at the beginning of the year to \$4,306.76 at the end of the year. This includes \$3.60 remaining in the Memorial Fund for Frankie Kirkaldy and \$700.00 in the Carry-over contingency fund. So far in the Month of July we have had income of \$273 and expenditures of \$1224, leaving us with a bank balance of \$3455.76."

FOLLOW-UP:

- Laura, and new co-treasurer, Spence Putnam, met for a transitional meeting with outgoing Treasurer, Becky Stratton. It was decided that Laura will handle deposits, dispersements and accounting; Spence will prepare reports.
- It was agreed to transfer the remaining \$3.60 from the Frankie Kirkaldy Memorial Account into the general account.
- A request has been made to support a Friend who would like to attend a workshop, "Rediscovering Eldering," at Powell House. It was approved to provide

tuition coverage for this workshop which will benefit MFM when the participant returns and shares the content with us.

08.07.04 Worship and Study Committee (presented by Win Colwell)

- The completed Spiritual Life Survey was presented. The committee will circulate this survey among all MFM participants. Everyone expressed approval of the content, spirit and intention of this survey.
- On July 23, the Ticonderoga Worship Group Clearness Committee met at New York Yearly Meeting at Silver Bay, NY. Jean Rosenberg and Carrie Reed attended from MFM. Carrie reported that there is concern about the low attendance and concern about the difficulty of asking Friends to cover for Mark and Mary Kay when they are away. However, It was the sense of this committee for the worship group to continue.

08.07.05 Pastoral Care Committee (from Carrie Reed) did not meet this month. John Beattie will begin to serve as convener.

o8.07.06 Fellowship Committee (from Wendy Goodwin) will next meet in September. There are currently two active members of the committee and they would welcome increasing their number. They will ask the Nominating Committee to identify additional members. Any Friend who feels led to serve on the Fellowship Committee should speak to Cheryl Mitchell, Nominating Committee, or Wendy Goodwin or Fran Putnam, Fellowship Committee members.

o8.07.07 Outreach and Social Action Committee (from Karen Nawn-Fahey, edited for these minutes by the recording clerk)

- June Community Supper: A thank you note was received from Dottie Neuberger, Community Supper coordinator. \$59 was donated by guests at the supper, all of which was given to the church to help replace the food they lost when the freezer broke. Friends are reminded that they can donate "turkey" points from Shaw's to the Community Supper at any time.
- Future Community Supper: We have been offered two dates: September 26 or October 3 to host our next Community Supper. A "localvore" theme has been suggested, enabling us to showcase local food, and our garden bounty.
- FOLLOWUP: September 26 was chosen as our preferred date. We agreed to repeat our June meal of vegetarian lasagna and fresh salad which was very well received. A chair, or co-chairs, are needed to coordinate the Sept. 26 meal. Anyone interested should talk with Karen or any other Outreach Committee member.
 - Post Office Box #1026 is our new MFM mailing address. We suggest a "Calling All Publications" by individual Friends who receive publications or other mailings

on behalf of the meeting. It is recommended that Treasurer, Laura Asermily have a key. The other key might go to someone who can check the box easily from town and bring mail to meeting for distribution.

- FOLLOWUP: The second key will be kept by either Karen Nawn-Fahey or Stuart Kirkaldy. They will decide between themselves.
 - College Outreach: Efforts are underway to coordinate with Laurie Jordan and Ellen MacKay at Middlebury College to facilitate communication about MFM Meetings and Events that would be of interest to college students.

Monthly Meeting ended with a few moments of silence.
