**16.03.01** Monthly meeting opened with a reading from Patricia Loring's Listening Spirituality, Vol II.

16.03.02 February 21, 2016 minutes accepted as printed in the newsletter.

16.03.03 Treasurer's Report (Karen Nawn-Fahey): All statements in this report are as of February 29, 2016.

During February, the Meeting did not have any donations.

During February, Meeting expenditures totaled \$420. This includes \$100 to Claire Armstrong for childcare and \$320 to Lianna Tennal for children's program coordination (January and February). When these checks clear, the bank balance will be \$4732.02.

IN ADDITION: Karen reported \$900 donated in Stewart Kirkaldy's memory. Friends discussed causes near and dear to his heart, including exploring a NEYM project for social justice; camperships to China Lake Camp (perhaps a fund for children of prisoners);

FCNL projects; Birds of Vermont Museum; books related to his interests donated to Ilsley Library. We were reminded the money can be divided and contributed to more than one cause. COSA will consult with Stewart's close friend, Ted Colwell, and Karen will continue her follow up with Stewart's son, Andy.

**16.03.04** Earthcare Committee (no meeting in March): Laura Asermily noted that Climate Justice Month runs from March 22, World Water Day, through April 22, Earth Day, also the day MFM hosts Community Supper.

Susan Smiley reported on the most recent ICAN meeting. The group hopes to identify a single project to focus on, e.g., create a vehicle, perhaps a skit, to take around to communities.

### 16.03.05 Committee on Outreach and Social Action - COSA (Don Peabody)

- Planning is underway for the April 22<sup>nd</sup> Community Supper provided by Middlebury Friends. Sign-up sheets will be circulated at Meeting and via listserv.
- Tom Dickinson takes the lead eliciting local Friends' help setting FCNL's priorities for the upcoming 115<sup>th</sup> Congress. Middlebury Friends will be contacted for input through the listserv.
- In collaboration with Fellowship and Children's Program Committees, COSA is organizing a NEYM-sponsored workshop titled Journey of Healing to take place on the morning of April 30<sup>th</sup> at CSAC's Catamount Park facility.

**16.03.06** Worship and Study Committee (Peter Schenck): Co-clerk, Tom Baskett, has forwarded the State of the Meeting report to NWQM and NEYM.

The next Friendly Forum, April 24, is on the Testimony of Integrity.

**16.03.10** Nominating Committee (Sas Carey) reported that Friends are asked to consider if they wish to continue in current positions, step down, or serve in a different capacity.

**16.03.11 Stewart Kirkaldy Memorial Minute**: Win is in communication with Westport (MA) Meeting to learn if they wish to prepare their own memorial minute cont.
