

14.11.01 Treasurer's Report (submitted by Karen Nawn-Fahey):

All statements in this report are as of November 14, 2014.

During October the Meeting had member donations of \$1030.

During October, meeting expenditures totaled \$1684. This includes \$499 to NEYM, \$600 to Havurah, \$125 to NWQM, \$320 for Childcare and First Day School Coordination, \$90 to Paige Keren for childcare, \$15 to Wren Colwell for childcare, \$15 to Claire Armstrong for childcare and \$20 for sausage for Community Supper.

Donations for the Emergency Warming Shelter totaled \$1675. The added \$100 from the contingency brings the total to \$1775. We have already received confirmation and warm thanks from the Charter House Coalition.

In November, benevolences totaling \$3925 were paid.

When these checks clear, the bank balance will be \$2623.57.

2015 Proposed Budget (presented by Karen Nawn-Fahey on behalf of the Finance Committee) The proposed budget was considered with the following noted: Two items were moved, NEYM scholarship to Benevolences, and Quaker Camps and Conferences to general expenses. It was agreed to add a line item for Pastoral Care Committee, adding \$200 to the budget. This money may be used to reimburse Friends who provide transportation and other kinds of support to individuals. It was agreed that the Treasurer will purchase \$140 worth of gas cards for use during the remaining fiscal year.

The proposed budget with the addition of a new line item for Pastoral Care will be printed in the newsletter in preparation for final approval at January monthly meeting.

14.11.02 Committee on Outreach and Social Action (COSA) (submitted by Don Peabody, interim clerk, edited by the recording clerk)

The Committee met two times in the last month.

The following items were discussed:

- a report on September Community Supper
- planning for Northwest Quarterly's Meeting in March, 2015
- discussion about the future of COSA: should it continue and, if so, with what membership, purpose and function?

Outcomes:

- A draft of a revised "COSA description" was presented, critiqued, and referred to a committee (Ted Colwell and Don Peabody) for further re-drafting.
- Tom Dickinson will take the lead organizing the March Quarterly Meeting.
- Ted Colwell will serve as AFSC liaison.
- Next meeting time, date and place: TBA

14.II.03 Earthcare Committee (submitted by Fran Putnam, edited by the recording clerk) The committee has not met since the last Meeting for Business, but the following activity has occurred:

1. Earthcare Committee will read the Query in November and alternate with Worship and Study every other month in the future.
2. Middlebury Area Clergy Association: Fran and Spence Putnam will meet with a group representing area clergy on December 17, 4:00 PM, at the Weybridge Congregational Church to discuss ways to collaborate on our mutual concern for the climate and the environment. Other members of MFM are invited to attend.

14.II.06 Worship and Study Committee (W & S) (notes from Priscilla Baker)

1. Friendly Forums: Priscilla reported on the October friendly forum on vocal ministry attended by 8 participants, including 3 W & S members. She reviewed topics about vocal ministry that were discussed. Also, several ideas were suggested and considered for future friendly forums. FOLLOW UP: Jean will draft a statement on vocal ministry. This might be printed in the newsletter, from time to time, and be an insert in the Welcome Card.
3. Ad Hoc Committee on committee structure: Priscilla and Jean amended the 2007 description for W & S based on discussion at the first ad hoc committee meeting. More adjustments were discussed and put into place.
4. Composition of W & S: It was agreed we would benefit from adding one more person to the committee. Although unsuccessful, last spring, to find a new member, we will revisit possibilities.
5. State of the Meeting meeting planning was begun, scheduled for January 25, 2015, location TBA.

14.11.07 **Concern about respect and safety within MFF:** A concern was discussed about how to assure that we practice respectful communications within our spiritual community. We agreed we want always to be mindful that the trust within our community is not jeopardized by protecting the safety of everyone. It was agreed that when this trust is violated by anyone within MFM the clerks will speak with all parties affected and, when indicated, use Quakerly eldering.

14.11.08 **Northwest Quarterly Meeting, March 2015** (presented by Tom Dickinson) MFM will host, with South Starksboro Friends Meeting, the March 2015 QM. Planning details need to be submitted to the QM clerk and the N'orwester newsletter by mid-January. Tom will explore the possibility of using our previous venue and consult with S. Starksboro Friends about a program and other details. Friends are needed to serve on an ad hoc planning committee. Don Peabody and Lianna Tennial, QM Oversight Committee members, will help as will the Fellowship Committee.

Monthly meeting closed after a period of silence.
